PRESENT BY-LAWS

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE GADSDEN COUNTY MEN OF ACTION BUSINESS(BUILDING)

The Board Of Directors will consist of seven members, Chairman, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasure Secretary, Building Manager, Parlimentarian and Chaplin.

Purpose:

To preserve the legacy of the Gadsden County Men Of Action thru financial support by recruitment for the purpose of leasing, fund raising and decision making regarding the Business Aspect and Upkeep of the Business (Building) called the Gadsden County Men Of Action Building.

Function:

The Board will function as an organizational sudsidiary of The Gadsden County Men Of Action for income development and support of the organization called The Gadsden County Men Of Action. The status of the Board will be determined by applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code, as appropriate. The Board making decisions will include but not limited to deciding what businesses are appropriate for the building, changing the structure of the building, deciding the amount and duration of a lease, deciding what is included and/or involved in the lease payment such as light bill, water, garbage etc., interviewing and making employment decisions for the business(building), naming the building with suggestions from the main body of The Gadsden County Men Of Action, handling and making emergency decisions, developing a budget for the business(building) before July of each fiscal year, deciding the responsibilities of each member of the Board Of Directors, Terms of office for each member of the Board, report and make depositions for the Board, decide meeting times for the Board Of Directors, including call meetings, develop policy and procedures for the Business (Building), and let Sati any other responsibilities deemed necessary by the Board Of Directors and/or The Gadsden County Men Of Action. The meeting dates for the Board of Directors are the 3rd Sunday evenings of each month at 4PM. Other meetings will be called by the Chairman as needed.

Rules Of The Business(Building):

Mission:

The Mission of the Board Of Directors is to enhance and support the continued existence of The Gadsden County Men Of Action and its Business(Building) called the Gadsden County Men Of Action Building by developing lease agreements, fund raising, and influencing communities, governments, individuals, and businesses that will support the organizations priorities.

Membership:

The present members of the Board will serve for the duration of the loan agreement with the Federal Conference African Methodist Episcopal Credit Union and The Gadsden County Men Of Action and/or its trustees. Each member of the Board must be a member of The Gadsden County Men Of Action.

Election Of Officers:

The Board will nominate officers. All elected and appointed nominees must meet the qualifications for office at the time of nomination.

Officers:

See The Board Of Directors above

Nomination and Election Of Officers:

Will be determined by the Board at a time designated by the Board, except for the original organizational meeting.

Nominating Procedures:

Will be determined by the Board at a time designated by the Board, except for the original organizational meeting.

Elections:

Made by show of hands

Voter Eligibility:

A member in good standing with the Board

Officers:

Chairman-This person is a member in good standing with the Gadsden County Men Of Action, must show strong leadership ability, willing to work with members while maintaining peace and harmony, must attend all meetings except for excused absences determined by the

board. Capable of preparing an agenda in continuity, for the Board meetings. Duties-Preside at all meetings, speak on behalf of the Board, one of the authorized signatures on all checks, and perpetuate a positive image of the Gadsden County Men Of Actions, prepare the agenda for all meetings with the consideration of request from other members for the agenda

Vice Chairman-This person is a member in good standings with the Gadsden County Men Of Action, must show strong leadership ability, willing to work with members while maintaining peace and harmony, attend all meetings except for excused absences determined by the Board. Capable of preparing an agenda in continuity, for the Board meetings. Duties-Preside at all meetings in abscence of the Chairman, presides over all meetings designated by the Chairman, perpetuate a positive image of the Gadsden County Men Of Action, maybe authorized as a check signer, prepare the agenda for all meetings with the consideration of request from other members for the agenda

Secretary-This person is a member in good standings with The Gadsden County Men Of Action, should be capable of accurately recording the proceeding of The Board Meetings, and report them to the body of Gadsden County Men Of Action, also for future references as appropriate. Duties-Record minutes for all meetings, maintain records as the official custodian of minutes.

Treasure/Secretary-This member must be in good standings with the Gadsden County Men Of Action. Capable of keeping accurate financial records and maintaining them. Duties-Receive Bank Statements from P.O.Box, member of the budget committee, receives and receipt all monies at all Board functions and surrendering all funds collected to the Board Of Directors Business(Building) account, reconciles check registry as needed, give monthly financial reports to responsible for the care and custody of all funds for the Business(Building) and authorized as one of the signatures on all checks, drafts, and vouchers, record minutes in the meeting in the absence of the secretary.

Parliamentary-This person must be in good standings with The Gadsden County Men Of Action, have knowledge of Robert's Rule Of Order, and Parliamentary procedures. Duties-Provide answers on parliamentary procedures and constitutional issues, provides pareliamentary rulings when requested.

Chaplin-This member must be in good standings with the Gadsden County Men Of Action, experience a level of comfort using christian presentations. Duties-Present opening and closing prayer at all meetings, maintain record of deceased members with the Secretary.

Manager-This peson must be in good standings with the Gadsden County Men Of Action, must be available for entrance or provide access to the building when called upon by members of The Board Of Directors, willing to provide needed information on the building as determined by the Board. Duties-provide access to the building upon request by the

Board,responsible for making suggestion for repairs, improvements, contacting appropriate individuals, for maintenance of the Building, any other responsibilities deemed necessary by the Board to maitain the building, make sure the building is successfully secured after each activity, may be designated as a check signer, Bring the concerns of the leasee to the Board Of Directors for considerations.

Removal Of Officers:

A.)The Board may temporarily suspend an officer by majority vote of the Board Of Directors members present. This suspension cannot exceed forty-five (45) days. The Officer may make an appeal for a review by the Executive Board Of Gadsden County Men Of Action who will vote to advise the Board Of Directors for either removal or maintain the suspension by a said period of time, in which if the suspended member is not satisfied may take legal action against the Board Of Directors and/or The Gadsden County Men Of Action, The Board Of Directors may sustain, modify or rescind the suspension action. Ruling of the Board Of Directors with a majority vote will be final.

Committees:

Budget and Finance Committee:

- A.)Composition and Duties.
- 1.)Consist of recording secretary, treasure/secretary, and at least two other members of The Board Of Directors.
- B.)Prepare an annual budget before July of each fiscal year and submit it to the Executive Board Of The Gadsden County Men Of Action for approval at the next meeting.
- C.)Monitor the budget throughout the year and submit recommendations to the Executive Board Of The Gadsden County Men Of Action for approval.

Policy and Procedure Committee:

The Chairman of the Board Of Directors shall appoint a committee to review the Policies and Procedures for possible revision and updating as required; but at least once every two years. Proposed changes, if any, shall be be submitted to the Board Of Directors to be voted on to submitt it to the Executive Board Of The Gadsden County Men Of Action for approval.
