Agenda item #4: Utility Tree Trimming Services Summary of the Discussion by Staff and the Commission

Director Ash stated that the city sent out to bid a tree trimming proposal.

Director Ash stated that Wolf Tree was the only company which responded to the RFP.

Director Ash stated that the Wolf Tree proposal consists of a three-person crew along with a bucket truck and a chipper. The hourly rate is \$122.21.

Commissioner Harris stated the following:

- Wolf Tree requested a rate increase last fiscal year. Wolf Tree severed ties with the city when the rate increase was denied by the Commission.
- Wolf Tree did not provide proper documentation of work completed. Wolf Tree provided only time sheets for payment. No checks and balances and because of this, not in agreement with the proposal.
- Stated that the Wolf Tree contract pre-dates the employment of City Manager Nixon and Utilities Director Ash and his concerns does not reflect them.
- Wolf Tree provided inconsistencies in locations where they were cutting.
- Stated that Wolf Tree truck was unmarked, so they were hard to locate.
- Stated that on occasions he rode around the city looking for Wolf Tree working and could not find them.
- Has integrity issues with Wolf Tree.
- Would like to explore more options on how to get tree trimming work completed.
- City workers were responsible for tree trimming prior to the Wolf Tree contract.
- Takes no issue with the line item to hire a tree trimming company.
- Stated that there is a need for tree trimming.
- Stated that there should be evidence somewhere in the city of Wolf Tree's work.
- Stated that there must be a person dedicated inspecting future tree trimming work.

Commissioner Bass-Prieto stated that she's concern that only one company responded to the tree trimming RFP.

Commissioner Bass-Prieto stated that since there hadn't been any tree trimming, her power has been off five times.

Commissioner Sapp shared her concerns on Wolf Tree's accountability.

Commissioner Sapp suggested training staff to do the tree trimming work.

Commissioner Sapp stated that her lights were out this morning.

Commissioner Sapp thanked Commissioner Harris for his report on Wolf Tree.

Commissioner Sapp noted that the county is currently working on cutting tree's back.

Director Ash stated that the city needs to get on a tree cutting cycle.

Commissioner Sapp suggested that the city manager investigate drafting a tree trimming contract that provides more specifics.

City Manager Nixon stated that history teaches that the Wolf Tree trimming contract was not managed properly.

City Manager Nixon stated that the agenda item is to bring to the Commission's attention that the results of the tree trimming RFP.

City Manager Nixon stated that staff could work towards bringing tree trimming back in house.

City Manager Nixon stated that he's concerned with tree trimming not currently being done and the increases in power outages.

Mayor Pro Tem Canidate reiterated that it is unacceptable that Wolf Tree's work cannot be accounted for.

Commissioner Bass-Prieto suggested looking into piggybacking off the City of Tallahassee's tree trimming contract again.

Commissioner Sapp offered a motion to table the discussion at the city manager's request and to allow staff time to research other options for the Commission to consider.

City Manager Nixon stated that Dewberry Engineers recommends Dixie Paving and Grading Inc.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that Dixie Paving was the only bidder at \$150,517.99.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that this project includes everything that was presented to the Commission, except easement cleaning.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that new drainage pipes would be installed along Willie Ruth Road along with multiple inlets.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that due to excess root growth not seen in the pictures, there will be a need of a change order to complete some easements.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that he could not provide a cost for the change order.

Dewberry Rep Matt Chester stated that with the current design, water would be able to drain properly, and Willie Ruth Road and Flagler Streets would not occur heavy flooding.

Commissioner Sapp noted that only one contractor responded to the bid.

Commissioner Harris stated that the city has nothing to compare to Dixie Paving bid.

Commissioner Bass-Prieto requested that the city manager investigate areas where there is piping without easements.

Mayor Pro Tem Canidate stated that Dixie Paving bid came under the budget.

Mayor Pro Tem Canidate stated how excited she is to see the project moving forward.

Mayor Pro Tem Canidate offered a motion to approve the bid award recommendation from Dewberry Engineers, Inc and award the bid to Dixie Paving & Grading LLC in the amount of \$150,517.99.


WHEREAS, the City of Quincy has requested the closing of certain roads for its 2022 Trunk of Treats to be held on Monday, October 31st, 2022: and,

The Florida Department of Transportation are requesting the City of Quincy to enter in additional Maintenance Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation for Public Works Department to maintain additional sidewalks.

Background:

This Maintenance Agreement (MOA) between the City of Quincy and the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) is preparing to construct a 6-foot-wide sidewalk for approximately 5,600 linear feet along U.S. 90 from Chalk Street to Ralph Strong Road within GADSDEN COUNTY. Working under 448451-1 will also include the construction of a 50-foot-long observation pier at Tanyard Branch. To maintain the observation pier and its associated components within the project.

Components to be maintained include riprap and bedding stone, pier timber railing and decking, stringers, pile caps, timber piles, pedestrian aluminum handrail, wire mesh within the pedestrian railing and all associated fasteners.

Analysis:

MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (hereinafter called "DEPARTMENT") and the CITY OF QUINCY (hereinafter called "CITY"). The DEPARTMENT and the CITY are sometimes referred to in this AGREEMENT as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- 1. The DEPARTMENT is preparing to construct a 6-foot-wide sidewalk for a distance of approximately 5,600 linear feet along U.S. 90 from Chalk Street to Strong Road within GADSDEN COUNTY pursuant to Financial Project Identification Number 448451-1-52-01. Work under 448451-1-52-01 will also include the construction of a 50-foot-long observation pier at Tanyard Branch.
- 2. Once construction is completed, the CITY agrees to maintain the observation pier and associated components hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT. Components to be maintained include riprap and bedding stone, pier timber railing and decking, stringers, pile caps, timber piles, pedestrian aluminum handrail, wire mesh utilized within the pedestrian railing, and all associated fasteners. This PROJECT will be of benefit to the CITY.
- 3. The DEPARTMENT has jurisdiction over the operation and maintenance of the State Highway System;
- 4. The CITY has agreed to maintain the PROJECT in accordance with the terms below;
- 5. The CITY by CITY Council action on dated ______, 20___, a resolution is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated by reference, evidences the CITY's desire to enter into this Agreement and its officers' authorization to do so; and

6. The DEPARTMENT is authorized pursuant to Section 334.044 and 335.055, Florida Statutes to enter into contracts and agreements with counties/municipalities for the maintenance of roadside facility improvements on the State Highway System.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived by the terms of this AGREEMENT, the parties agree to the following:

The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are deemed incorporated herein by reference.

7. Upon completion of construction by the DEPARTMENT, the CITY will assume responsibility for maintenance of the PROJECT and shall perform all activities necessary to keep all components fully operating, properly functioning, and in good condition. Required maintenance includes, but is not limited to repairing slope erosion, securing loose components, addressing any insect or weather-induced decay, removing graffiti, maintaining any associated signing, lighting, benches, litter receptacles, and aesthetic features, and replacing/fixing any missing or protruding fasteners. The CITY shall maintain pier deck surfaces free from residue accumulation, algae, vegetation, and other slip or trip hazards. All repairs or replacement will be in kind and in accordance with the components originally installed under 448451-1-52-01 unless a variance is approved in writing by the DEPARTMENT.

The CITY shall conduct an annual inspection of the PROJECT to ensure that any and all safety deficiencies are addressed.

- 8. Should the CITY desire to add future amenities to the observation pier the CITY shall contact the DEPARTMENT for prior approval.
- 9. The DEPARTMENT may remove, relocate, or adjust the sidewalk and/or observation pier in whole or in part at any time in the future as determined to be necessary by the DEPARTMENT in order that the adjacent State Road be widened, altered, or otherwise changed. The DEPARTMENT shall give the CITY notice regarding such removal, relocation, or adjustment.
- 10. When the observation pier is at the end of its useful life the CITY shall prioritize the replacement or reconstruction of the structure as if it was a new project.
- 11. All maintenance of the Facilities shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and all other applicable local, state, or federal laws, rules, resolutions, or ordinances, and DEPARTMENT procedures, and shall be subject to periodic inspections by the DEPARTMENT.

12. The CITY covenants and agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless to the extent provided by Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, the DEPARTMENT and all of the DEPARTMENT'S officers, agents and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge or expense arising out of any act, action, neglect or omission by the CITY during the performance of the contract, whether direct or indirect, and whether to any person or property to which the DEPARTMENT or said parties may be subject, except that neither the CITY nor any of its sub-contractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused or resulting from the sole negligence of the DEPARTMENT or any of its officers, agents or employees.

When either party receives notice of a claim for damages that may have been caused by the other party in the performance of services required under this Agreement, that party will immediately forward the claim to the other party. Each party will evaluate the claim and report its finding to each other within fourteen (14) working days and jointly discuss options in defending the claim. A party's failure to promptly notify the other of a claim will not act as a waiver of any right herein.

- 13. The DEPARTMENT'S District Secretary shall decide all questions, difficulties, and disputes of any nature whatsoever that may arise under or by reason of this Agreement, the prosecution or fulfillment of the service hereunder and the character, quality, amount and value thereof; and his decision upon all claims, questions and disputes shall be final and conclusive upon the parties hereto.
- 14. This AGREEMENT may be terminated under any one of the following conditions:
 - (A) By the DEPARTMENT if the CITY fails to correct a cited deficiency and perform its maintenance responsibility under this AGREEMENT, following fifteen (15) working days written notice;
 - (B) By the DEPARTMENT following sixty (60) calendar days' notice.
- 15. Pursuant to Section 287.058, Florida Statutes, the DEPARTMENT may unilaterally cancel this Agreement for refusal by the MAINTAINING AGENCY to allow public access to all documents, papers, letters or other material subject to the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and made or received by the MAINTAINING AGENCY in conjunction with this Agreement.
- 16. This AGREEMENT embodies the entire agreement and understanding between the parties hereto and there are no other agreements, understandings, oral or written, with

reference to the subject matter hereof that are not merged herein and superseded hereby.

17. This AGREEMENT shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the law of the State of Florida. The parties stipulate that venue for any matter relating to this contract shall be in Leon County, Florida.

18. The CITY shall:

- (A) utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the CITY during the term of the AGREEMENT; and
- (B) expressly require any subcontractors performing work or providing services pursuant to the state contract to likewise utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the subcontractor during the contract time.
- 19. Any and all notices given or required under this agreement shall be in writing and delivered via e-mail with a receipt acknowledgment or sent certified with return receipt to the following:








TYPICAL STRINGER TO CONCRETE CONNECTION DETAIL




TYPICAL RAIL POST TO PILE CAP CONNECTION DETAIL


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

Subject: Approval of the Purchase of a Small Backhoe

Statement of Issue/Justification: In July 2022, the City of Quincy's gas system small backhoe broke down during installation of a new gas service. This backhoe is 30+ years old and worn out from usage. Over the past several years the gas crew has been unable to keep the backhoe working continually which has forced the gas crews to rent backhoes to complete projects. At this point, the Utilities Department staff decided to red tag the backhoe as non-operable and asked for funding for a replacement.

<u>Conclusion/Background/Recommendations:</u> In the fiscal 2023 approved budget, \$25,000 was budgeted for the replacement of the small backhoe for the gas division. The replacement backhoe is listed on the FY23 State of Florida vehicle purchase contract. Staff checked with an approved vendor (Ag-Pro) and obtained a price of \$22,158.51 for the replacement.

General Recommendation: Staff recommends the Commission approve the purchase of a small backhoe using the State of Florida vehicle purchase contract at the price of \$22,158.51.
