#### Statement of Issue/Justification:

The current SCOP project located on South Stewart Street from US 90 to Stewart Street School has been substantially complete for well over six weeks now except for the south bound lane from approximately GF&A Drive south for 400 lineal feet. This portion of the work was paved but due to the base, the pavement unraveled when traffic was placed on it. The determination was that base was too wet causing a weakening, either from and water main break or from subsurface moisture. Either way, this portion will require repaving to complete the project.

#### Conclusion/Background/Recommendations:

Provided for your information is a proposed Change Order #3 submitted by CW Roberts Contracting for the repair of the area. Also provided are emails showing the overall funding for the project. The proposed corrective action to repair the area are as follows: 1) Failed areas to be cut and patched with asphalt base,2) Allow area to cure for 14 days, and 3) Mill 1" and then place the final 1" of finished asphalt. For your further information, staff, and Anchor both have requested additional funding from FDOT for this repair but received word that their funds for the SCOP have been depleted due to the rise in costs during the last two years and they have no funds in which to help with this responsibly.

**General Recommendation**: Staff recommends the Commission approve the Change Order #3 in the sum of \$16,038.67 so that we can finally complete this project.

#### JUSTIFICATION:

Failed areas of the project are to be cut and patched with an asphalt base. Prior to proceeding with the 1-inch milling and resurfacing, a 14-day cure period is required following the application of the base to allow the asphalt to settle/cure and to ensure that there is no significant rutting of cracking. Then, a 14-day cure period is required before thermos can be painted on new asphalt. The Contractor has requested an extension of 60 days in order to complete the work outlined in this change order. It is therefore, recommended that the Contract Time be extended by 60 days.

The amount of the Contract will be Increased Decreased/Unchanged) by the Sum of SIXTENN-THOUSAND, THIRTY-EIGHT DOLLARS AND SIXTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$16,038.67).

Thank you, Maria -

Just to confirm what you guys are seeing against what we see. With FDOT SA#1 the FDOT Construction budget was increased to \$576,977.85 and with CO#3 it will bring FDOT's project cost to \$593,016.52.

At the beginning of this project during the bidding phase, FDOI stated that the City would need to cover \$16,495.00 of the project costs and with CO#1 which the City included on their budget, it brought the City's total budget to \$12,157.73.

The City has no additional funding available at this time to cover this Change Order so we were wanting some confirmation from FDOT that they agree to the budget increase to \$593,016.52. From what we can see, the budget for FDOT following the signing of this change order would be more than what was delegated in SA#1. Please confirm.

Maria,

The attached CO proposal (\$16,038.67 & 40 additional days) is a cost reduction from the initial proposal ACEI submitted on 11-02-22 in amount of \$19,488.67. The difference represents performing the base repair & corresponding resurfacing in 2 separate operations vs. 1 operation. The initial proposal included an additional observation period agreed to between the City and the Contractor.

I do not believe an additional observation period is necessary and creates needless additional costs.

#### COST

\*The attached reduced CO amount represents performing all work in a single operation, thus reducing the amount of costs associated with Mobilization & M.O.T. <u>I recommend FULL Participation in the requested amount of \$16,038.67</u>. Costs are based on original bid and comparable to Statewide Averages.

#### TIME

\*Per the attached, the Contractor is requesting an additional 40 days to perform the work; these 40 days include the additional observation period of "2-3 weeks" per ACEI email dated 11-02-22 below. For the time aspect, I recommend a PARTIAL participation of 21 days; this time is specific to the Prime Contractor & Subcontractor (thermoplastic striping) scheduling aspect and is not intended to be associated with an additional observation period.

Of course.

Q: Why is an additional observation period required beyond the 30 days initial? I reviewed the site today and the distressed areas have stabilized, so the extended observation period seems unnecessary and creates additional Mobilization, MOT, & material costs. CWR included the observation period is because the City wanted a guarantee that there would not be no cracking or rutting after we made the repairs. In order to better guarantee this to the City and avoid risking the chance of having those failures show up in the final mat, CWR recommended to first install the asphalt base and then let traffic run on in it, so that in the case there were any failures or defects we could address those issues prior to performing the mill and resurface. But, I agree that it's an additional cost. I talked to CWR and they agreed to reduce the cost (see attached, revised Change Order Amount). In this case, and if CWR will waive the observation period prior to milling & resurfacing, both items of work can be performed in the same operation, as shown in the revised pricing.

Q What is proposed total depth of existing asphalt/base excavation? 4" below existing asphalt.

Q How does Contractor propose to remove existing material?

If the base installation is performed in a separate operation from the milling & resurfacing, CWR would saw cut and excavate. If installed in the same operation as the milling and resurfacing, they will remove the existing material with the milling machine and backhoe or skid steer.

Good Morning Rick, Vickie, and Maria,

As you're all aware, we have run into a construction issue in the City of Quincy on Stewart Street Phase I (FPID 446065-1-54-01).

To summarize, starting at station 44+07 and heading south both lanes, CWR was to reclaim asphalt roadway to a depth of 6". In the south bound lane at approximately station 43+00 heading south, CWR encountered a wet base material of dense red clay.

CWR reclaimed, rolled, clipped and repaved the southbound lane from station 44+07 to 15+17. During the reclaim and paving operations of the northbound lane, CWR noticed an area of extremely wet clay which was pumping and waving ahead of the roller. This area was northbound approximately 41+00 to 42+50. As CWR rolled this area water started to flow to the surface and run down the recently rolled out material. CWR


stopped operations and called the city to report a probable water leak. The City of Quincy bought in a backhoe and during the time of investigation hit the 10" water main. The City of Quincy had not yet located the shut offs for the main so this resulted in an extended amount of time that the water ran down the hill and eroded the newly rolled base. Over the weekend, the City perform watermain repairs and it should be noted that the main failed 2 more times during that weekend. CWR resumed work the following week, but subsequently, the finished roadway has experienced several locations of base failure.

Seams; of area effected approximately 43+85 to 38+2 Failed mat areas; all areas affected are approximate.

- 1. 41+6 to 41+5 southbound lane
- 2. 41+62 to 41+55 southbound lane
- 3, 38+82 to 38+55 southbound lane

Based exposed to running water; 38+20 to 42+20 northbound.

1st water main break; approximately 42+00



CWR, the City, Anchor, and Dewberry met onsite to evaluate the failures and decided to let the road sit for 30 days to see if new failures occur. No new failures occurred during this time. Now, we have a proposal from to fix the damaged areas.

CWR is proposing to demo the failing areas then excavate 4" below the asphalt and put asphalt base in lieu of lime rock. They will pave up to the existing surface, and leave in place for 2-3 weeks to allow traffic to run over the repaired areas. Upon agreement from all parties that the problem is fixed, they will mill and overlay 1" from the southbound lane for a distance of 200'.

Attached is a signed change order form and the original proposal from CWR. This number has been negotiated with CWR already.

I know that was a lot of information but Rick is already very familiar with the issues and has done a site visit. However, please call me with additional questions/comments.

This problem is the result of a series of unfortunate events. We are requesting that the FDOT particulate and approve this Change Order so that we can bring this project to a successful close and have a project that the City and FDOT can be happy with.

#### Statement of Issue/Justification:

The City of Quincy Water System functions 24 hours a day 7 days a week supplying potable water to our citizens. An integral part of the system is the Hydro Instruments chlorination system. This system functions to disinfect water making it drinkable. The chlorination system is twenty years old, and parts of the system no longer function properly. The chlorine analyzer at the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) failed in 2014. The analyzer lets the WTP operators know when the chlorine residual of the water entering the distribution system is out of tolerance. Also, we have a problem keeping the chlorination ejector at the wellfield in service. Due to the units age, we can no longer find replacement motors for the adjustment mechanism.

#### Conclusion/Background/Recommendations:

In the fiscal 2023 approved budget funds were approved for the replacement of the chlorine analyzer and the chlorine injection unit. All of the City of Quincy's chlorination system is manufactured by a company named Hydro Instruments. We do not wish to replace the entire system, just the parts that are no longer serviceable. These two items are not interchangeable with produces produced by other chlorine system manufacturers. Further, Hawkins Inc. is the sole source sales representative for Hydro Instruments in the Alabama, Northwestern Florida, and Southwestern Georgia region. The quote we received from Hawkins Inc. for a chlorine analyzer and the chlorine injection unit is \$6,750.00.

**General Recommendation**: Staff recommends the Commission approve the purchase of a Hydro Instruments chlorine analyzer and the chlorine injection unit from Hawkins Inc. for the price of \$6,750.00.
